Our PSHE Lead Mrs Dolby, oversees the delivery of the 'SCARF' Coram education programme, in addition to providing appropriate and updated training to all staff.



Curriculum Design:

PSHE is taught through the 'SCARF' Coram education programme. Revisiting concepts and topics areas, each time extending knowledge, deepening understanding and developing skills.

Curriculum Intent:

At Manor Park Infant School and Nursery, we believe that nurturing happy and healthy children is central to every aspect of their learning and development. Within PSHE, pupils develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to manage their lives now and in the future. We want our children to learn how to understand and regulate their feelings and know what it means to be kind, honest and reliable. In addition, we want children to recognise and value difference and grow up to be tolerant of others. At Manor Park PSHE through our curriculum centres around a growth mindset approach, promoting positive behaviour, mental health, well-being, resilience and achievement. It provides children with a safe learning environment, to practice and develop these skills necessary to manage the moral, social and cultural challenges and responsibilities that are part of growing up and living in the world today.

Our Vision:

At Manor Park our PSHE curriculum centres around the values and growth mindset approach which promotes positive behaviour, mental health, well-being, resilience and achievement. Our curriculum is developed around the 'Scarf' Coram education programme which encompasses our school values and strong links with British Values. SCARF stands for Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience and Friendship. The lessons promote discussion topics, circle time, role play, decision making and sharing of opinions and experiences with the class.

Subject Skills:

Our PSHE runs through all that we do at Manor Park. Staff focus on the wellbeing of children and allow opportunities in every aspect of the curriculum to discuss wellbeing, health, safety and emotions where possible. Staff swiftly respond to the needs of children and ensure additions to planning and timetables to accommodate, individuals, group and class needs. Staff use the EYFS Framework (2021) to plan and deliver the PSED curriculum alongside SCARF programme as well as through topics in all areas of learning.

Subject Enrichment/Wider school Curriculum:

At Manor Park we believe that meaningful PSHE curriculum is key to children becoming confident, and well-rounded individuals as they grow in to adults. PSHE is fully integrated into our curriculum and taught in line with our cross-curricular approach, through topics as well as our RE, P.E and science curriculum. Widening our children's experiences and giving them hands on experience is integral to our teaching and learning of PSHE. We aim to improve our children's capital, including inviting visitors into school, and going on school trips. Weekly assemblies introduce and discuss topics including the programme of study from SCARF.
